

CALL FOR SPECIAL MEETING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,¹ this 19th day of October 2024 that:

The Hindu Society of Nevada (“Society”) has been seemingly operating under two different iterations of Bylaws, according to certain Trustees/Members of the Society and Hindu Community:

Bylaws of the Hindu Society of Nevada (Sept. 1, 1994) (viewed by significant Members as the original, and legal Bylaws)	The “Amended and Restated Bylaws of the Hindu Society” (dated June 2021) – viewed by some Members as improperly adopted and unenforceable

This Call to Meeting is, therefore, requested pursuant to the 1994 Bylaws at Article V.4, permitting “10 members” or “10% of the total membership, whichever is more” to Call for a Special Meeting; AND 2021 Bylaws, Article 5.4, permitting one-third “33.33%” of the General Membership to Call for a Special Meeting.² Members are encouraged to express their opinions on the Call by reviewing any Petition being circulated therefor.

The Call for Special Meeting is important to address certain issues:

1. Whether the 2021 Bylaws are illegal.
2. Whether the Society Trustees³ Can Banish Trustees by Simple Majority Vote.
3. Whether the Society Trustees Must Explain Their Taking of \$150,000 of Society Money.
4. Whether the Lawsuit Settled by Society Trustees Must be Disclosed.
5. Whether the Society Must Maintain Membership Rosters to Preserve Integrity.
6. Whether the Hindu Community Deserves Better Accountability by the Society Trustees.
7. Whether it is Time to Better Protect the Temple!

If the requisite numbers of Members affirm the need for a Special Meeting, then the proper Trustees/Members shall make the Call.
